

## **Market Report**

## 04/22/24:

**Asparagus:** Asparagus production has dropped due to seasonality from Caborca & San Luis, Mexico. Obregon, Mexico has started with low production. Peru continues to increase production. Markets remain the same. White asparagus continues to be very limited to non-existent from Peru.

**Guatemala outlook:** Temperatures continue to be warm, and the lack of rain is still slowing production.

**Baby Squash:** Baby zucchini production from Guatemala is still low due to weather.

**Berries: Blackberries** - Production is steady, but market is sluggish. **Blueberries** - Florida production continues to improve and Georgia has started with good production. Markets have become less active with more volume available. **Raspberries** - Mexican production continues to be low. Guatemalan production is very limited.

Carrots: Baby Orange, Baby Rainbow and Baby Bi-Color Carrots production is back to normal.

**Chilies**: Production is still slow due to weather. Prices continue to increase on most varieties. Orange habanero production is excellent.

**French Beans:** Production remains fairly low due to heat in Guatemala.

**Green Beans:** Production is good, quality is excellent.

**Herbs:** Basil quality continues to improve each week. We are still seeing some quality issues with **dill**. **Chervil** production has improved.

Mango: Mexican production is steady.

**Papaya:** Production is normal from Brazil. **Potatoes:** Good production on all varieties.



## **Market Report**

## 04/22/24:

**Radicchio:** Both West coast and Guatemalan supply is very limited due to weather and field transitions. Markets will continue to be elevated. Product from Italy is available, but limited, at a much higher cost than normal. Oxnard, CA harvesting has started this week which will help the gap.

**Roots:** Beet production from Canada continues to slow down due to seasonality. Mexican production is normal.

**Snow Peas/Sugar Snaps:** Guatemala production of snow peas and sugar snaps has dropped due to the heat and lack of rain. Markets are very active on both.

**Tomatoes: Baby Medley** and **Mixed Heirloom** flats supply is fair to good.

Other: Heirloom tomatoes, baby heirloom tomatoes, veggie sweet peppers, Euro cucumbers and Persian cucumbers production is steady with excellent quality. Chinese Eggplant production has slowed down due to weather. Colombian limes, domestic lemons and Mexican brussel sprouts and domestic mache continue to be available in Miami. Mexican broccoli florets will be available next week. Blood Oranges, Meyer Lemons, Kumquats and Cara Cara oranges continue to be available for the next couple of weeks. Chilean stone fruit is at the end of its season with limited supply. Expect domestic production to start in May. California cherries are expected to start the first week of May. Feijoas out of New Zealand are available. Watermelons are extremely limited due to weather related issues. Markets are very elevated.
