

9/11/25 Miami

Asparagus: Baja production has improved this week and should continue improving for the next three to four weeks. Sizing and quality have also improved. Peruvian production should start increasing within the next 10-14 days. Sizing should also improve, along with the increased volume. Markets are less active with more Mexican production.

Guatemala outlook: Shipping delays continue. Weather is still warm, and rain is affecting production.

Baby Squash:

• Baby zucchini production is excellent.

Baby sunburst production continues to be low to nonexistent.

Berries:

- Blackberries Production is excellent.
- **Blueberries** –Offshore fruit has started this week and should continue through mid-October.
- Raspberries Production continues to be steady from Guatemala for the next three weeks.

Carrots: Baby Orange, Baby Rainbow and **Baby Bi-Color** production from Guatemala is excellent.

Chilies: West coast production is good on most varieties. East coast production is low due to seasonality. This should change within the next two weeks.

- Orange habanero production has improved.
- Shishito peppers are improving from Mexico.

French Beans: Production remains good, but minor quality issues may be present due to heat and shipping delays.

Green Beans: Production is good from all regions with improved quality. Transition south has begun.

Herbs:

- **Basil** production is good from Colombia and Mexico. Quality issues have been present due to heat in the fields.
- Tarragon production should be back to normal starting this weekend.
- Imported chervil supply has improved from Ecuador.

Mango: Brazilian production is good, but costs are high because of 50% tariffs on Brazilian imports.

Papaya: Production and quality is good from Brazil. Expect higher markets soon due to imposed tariffs.

Potatoes: New crop fingerlings continue, but quality issues have been present.

Radicchio: West coast and Guatemalan production is good. Guatemalan quality is fair due to weather.

Roots: Production is normal from Mexico. Canadian production continues to increase.

Snow Peas/Sugar Snaps: Supply and quality on Guatemalan **snow peas** and **sugar snaps** are good. Peruvian production continues to be steady; quality remains fair.

Other: Production of Euro cucumbers, veggie sweet peppers, mixed heirloom tomatoes and baby heirloom tomatoes has improved this week Chinese Eggplant production is good, but quality has been poor this week. Argentinean lemons are done for the season.



9/11/25 Los Angeles

Asparagus: Baja production continues to be low due to transitions and seasonality. Peruvian production remains low due to cooler weather. We should see this change in 10 days as more fields in southern Peru start opening. Sizing from all regions is predominantly small and standard, with few bigger sizes. Markets are still active with less supply and sizing issues.

Baby Squash: Improved supply of **baby sunburst, patty pan** and **baby zucchini** from Mexico.

Carrots Peeled 5lb: Good supply of Mexican Baby Orange, Baby Rainbow and Baby Bi-Color Carrots.

Chilies: Fair to good supply on most varieties.

• Shishito supply is improving as both Mexican and domestic are available.

Cucumbers: Limited supply of Euro cucumbers from Mexico and Canada.

Persian cucumbers price is increasing due to weather related issues.

Endive: Domestic supply of **white** and **red** is good.

Beans: Improved supply of both organic and conventional

• French beans out of Guatemala. Container delays persist. Fair supply of conventional French beans out of Mexico.

Trimmed green beans supply is steady; quality is fair.

Ginger Root: Good supply overall.

Herbs:

- Basil supply and quality are good.
- Steady supply on all other herbs, except **chervil**, **marjoram** and **tarragon** which is limited due to weather related issues. Herb quality may be hit or miss due to heat.

Lettuce (Specialty Varieties): Limited supply, fair quality due to weather.

- Frisee supply is fair at best due to heat.
- Hydro Boston lettuce supply is limited due to less production/yield.

Peas: Domestic supply of **snow peas** and **sugar snaps** is fair at best. Prices are still elevated.

Potatoes: New crop fingerlings continue with good quality.

Radicchio/Treviso: Steady supply.

Sprouts (Brussels): Limited supply from Mexico. Organic product remains limited.

Root Veggies: Baby Bunch Carrots and Baby Bunch Beets (All varieties) are limited due to heat.

Celery root supply is fair.

Watermelon radish supply is limited due to weather.

Gold, red and candy beets are limited out of Mexico.

Rutabagas and Turnips supply is steady.

Parsnips will be hit or miss for the next two to three weeks because of field transitions.

Tomatoes: Steady supply of **Baby Medley tomatoes. Mixed Heirloom tomatoes** supply is improving.

Other: New crop California **Pomegranates** are available. **Persimmons** supply is expected to increase within the next few weeks. **Delicata, Red Kuri** and **Carnival squash** are available off the market this week.
